#### Table manners

When playing in the North/South position, remember to greet the incoming pair with a smile and a pleasant "Hello" or "Good evening". There's nothing worse for those travelling around the room to be ignored on arrival at a table due to an intense discussion of the follies or triumphs of the previous hand!

Conversely, if you're playing East/West, and have been delayed playing a hand, West should move on as soon as possible (don't stop to inspect the bridge tab!), and do apologise to your new North/South opponents for being late. If the table you are moving to is a bit slow, don't sit and finish your conversation because you can't move, that only holds up the pair behind you.

When calling the Director, do say "Director *please*", and remember to put your hand up. Of necessity the call for the Director must be loud, but the "please" makes it just a bit nicer for the Director to hear. And don't assume the Director will recognise your voice – that's why the hand in the air is useful so the Director can come to you as quickly as possible.
