

Annual Report 2021-2022

The year 2021-2022 has proven to be another year of disruption to bridge due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Once again there were several lockdowns, resulting in the cancellation of regional tournaments and the curtailing of some Kapi-Mana Bridge Club competition nights. The year also saw the implementation of mandatory measures to resist the spread of COVID. These included the compulsory requirement to provide vaccine passes, the use of masks and sanitizer, and the registration of attendance using QR codes.

It would be fair to say that at times not all members were in favour of these restrictions. The overriding consideration of the Committee was the health and safety of club members, a number of whom would be at heightened risk if they caught the virus.

When allowed under the alert or traffic light regimes, the club ran as many competition nights as was realistically possible. Many members have appreciated the opportunity to continue playing bridge in a safe face-to-face setting.

New Learners 2021-2022

2021 saw one of the largest intakes of aspiring new bridge players on record. Twenty four people completed the course and joined the club.
