#### To finish on an informative note

Some of you will be familiar with Bridge Base Online (BBO). You can download the app and there are many free to play options on it. Lori has provided these hints:


There is an option to play hands that have been bid, with the goal of improving your playing of the hands. It starts at a basic level and goes up from there. Some of the hands are very instructive.

Here's some instructions on how to do this:

- After logging in, select *Practice* under Play or Watch Bridge.
- On the next screen select Bridge Master. You can then choose a level of play to practice. Less experienced players may want to start at the beginner level and work their way up.
- You get to see the bidding which resulted in the contract you're to play. Then you play the hand. If you don't succeed, you may play the hand over again select from the blue triple dash (hamburger) icon upper left.

- You can always select "Show Solution" from the menu on the left edge of the screen and you'll be taken step by step through planning and making the contract, which is very instructive.
- If you choose *Competitive* (instead of Practice) and then select *Free Tournaments*, you can play in a daily eight hand ACOL game with robots, where you'll be ranked against all others who play the hands. Note: the robots don't always bid exactly as expected hovering over their bids will tell you what they think they meant this is a newer section on the site. They have been working on the robots to play ACOL better, and they have improved quite a bit. ① Otherwise the rest of the site will be playing Standard American.



Lori said there are also occasional free tournaments hosted by Auckland Bridge Club that will have you in some stiff competition if you like. During our first Covid lockdown, there were many free tournaments being hosted by the Auckland group, and as new players, we regularly came in last or near to last, but we kept coming back - learning as we went.
