# **Tip for July – Don't forget to "alert"**

Alerting your partner's bid is very important. An un-alerted bid can get you into trouble with the Director!

As a matter of course you must announce the meaning of your partner's 1NT or 1C opening.

If any bid your partner makes is not natural, it should be alerted, and, if asked, should be explained as fully as possible. Note the "if" – if you are not asked, you don't have to explain.

If you realise you have explained your partner's bid incorrectly, please call the Director immediately. If you have made the bid and you know your partner is confused, if your side ends up winning the contract call the Director at the end of play. You must not take advantage of unauthorised information you may have received from your partner's mistaken explanation.

### What don't you need to alert?

Cue bids are self-alerting, but if you're the opposition, it can be a good idea to ask what it means – it may not be what you think!

These bids are also self-alerting (i.e. don't need to be alerted):

- the 2C game force opening bid (and the 2D negative response unless your 2D means something different in which case it should be alerted)
- the simple Stayman 2C after a 1NT bid (and the 2D response denying a major)
- Doubles and redoubles
