NZ Bridge Congress

Eleanor and David Morel attended the annual NZ Bridge Congress tournament which was held in the first week of October in Tauranga. Many of you would have heard about Congress and wondered what it is like. Here's David's recollection (thanks for providing it):


Eleanor and I headed to Tauranga for the first week of October. Eight days of bridge morning and afternoon, 452 boards. We played the Open Pairs, Open Teams, Open Swiss Pairs, Karen Martelletti Memorial Open Teams. Our teammates were Lorraine Inglis and Judy Plimmer. It's a tough school – everyone who comes to your table is a very good player so there's no let-up.

The venue was excellent, aside from an air-con problem one morning when it became chilly.

The final event was the Karen Martelletii Memorial Teams – five matches on Friday followed by three on Saturday. On Friday we lost two and won three to be mid-table. For the first match on Saturday who should arrive at our table but the formidable pair of Geo Tislevol (perennial member of the NZ Open team) and Ken Yule (Gold Grandmaster). We had a solid set against them (39th of 87 on the datums) highlighted by this piece of daylight robbery by Eleanor.

6NT is really a pairs bid. A better teams auction might be:

	2 ∀ ¹	Pass	2NT ²
Pass	2 ∀ ³	Pass	4NT ⁴
Pass	5 ♦ ⁵	Pass	6♣

- 1 Multi weak major or 20-22 balanced
- 2 15+ any shape
- 3 Hearts weak
- 4 RKCB in Hearts
- 5 1 or 4 keycards here ♥A or K. If two she would bid 7NT

Ken led a Diamond removing the stopper. But never say die – the plays the thing. Eleanor ran the Clubs, then the Spades. The Spade Jack had fallen under the Clubs. At trick 11 the lead of the Spade Queen found Geo with holds in three suits: T spades, A hearts, K diamond. After much thought he decided Eleanor was void in Hearts and threw the Ace. The last two tricks were won by dummy's Hearts.

Kapi Mana Intermediate Tournament was a winner

We had a very successful tournament on 16 October with 20 pairs playing. Winners were Yvonne Helps and Kaye McCredie from Kapi Mana.
